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CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE SUMMER SCHOOL TO LEARN AND HAVE FUN

The summer courses that took place from July 25 to August 20 focused on tutoring children in math, Spanish, computer science, English, robotics, sports and arts, in addition to addressing the socio-emotional area. All activities were from Monday to Thursday from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. On Fridays, government institutions such as IMDET and Crime Prevention, would give different trainings.



Around 600 children attended, twice a week (based on the days assigned to their community) and one Friday every 2 weeks, to enjoy recreational and educational activities taught by 16 professors specialized in the subjects and scholarship recipients. 9 communities participated.

Inside the library we organize activities that motivate children and the youth to use the space. This also allows them to become familiar with it and make it feel their own. Additionally, because we want to make it fun, we are holding a reading contest. It is not hard to finish a book because we have very interesting books that have been donated by sponsors like the McCallan family. This library currently has over 9 hundred books and 500 in learning cells.

PROTECTED AND HAPPY KINDERGARTEN AND PRESCHOOL CHILDREN



This room is a great support for families who work in the CC, have small children, and don't have anyone that can take care of them. This space helps child development and offers activities to stimulate children's gross and fine motor skills.

Sandra Susana Bermejo, an Educational Assistant, is responsible for this area. She coordinates with volunteer mothers to care for boys and girls. They work Monday through Friday from 9am to 11am and 2pm to 5pm and Saturdays from 9am to 5pm.

WORKSHOPS TO LEARN AND OVERCOME DISPLAY OF BEAUTY SKILLS

For those who want to learn more about their personal life, increase their knowledge, or want to improve their finances, this community center offers more than 25 workshops taught by experts in the area, in addition to a free accreditation diploma. This is only in exchange for community service hours. We offer tutoring classes for Spanish, Mathematics, Science, and English, and college admission exam courses. In the workshops, we include different disciplines, such as ballet, mixed dance, folk dance, orchestra, and guitar.

PRE-UNIVERSITY WORKSHOP



With the participation of specialized teachers in different areas, an 18-session preparatory course was given to 20 students who are close to finishing high school, to reinforce their knowledge in mathematics, literature, and written and oral communication. This workshop seeks to ensure that they have the basic knowledge and skills to reach the next level and thus obtain the required score in the admission exams to continue excelling academically.

TRAINING FOR CENEVAL EXAMS

(Adult classes)



Under the coordination of Professor Louis Jacob and Erika Jacobo, BAM has teachers specialized in mathematics that have many years of higher education experience. Additionally we offer, free training for those that require the basic knowledge required to take the Ceneval exam. This program offers six-month courses on Saturdays scheduled from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. to prepare for the exam. To date, 25 students have enrolled..

BUSY WITH TECH WORKSHOPS

Thanks to the collaboration agreement with the CECATI Training Center for Industrial work, the workshop taught basic technological skills and the use of applications and IT tools (PowerPoint, Excel, Outlook, among others). This is so necessary in our times, to use in the organization of an office or unit.

With mastery of these programs daily tasks are facilitated and essential within a company, such as publishing texts, calculating equations, creating presentations, and so on. This way the 55 registered students may have a better performance in the workplace. At the end of the workshop, they receive an official certificate



FOURTH EDITION OF THE MEXICAN DREAM

At this stage, the aim is to expand the program by tracking our 10 young talents who have been participants for 3 generations of the program. Initially, 34 attendees registered, seeking to select the next members of Young Talent. With the aim of incorporating 20 fathers and mothers of the family to generate a sense of belonging to the community, responsibility, and development of family relationship skills.



This time there is a projection of 33 sessions, where the 3 groups of approach simultaneously, which began on the 5th of March for the group of 50 children, and the second group and parent school on April 2, with the culmination for the 3 groups on September 03.

LEARNING CELLS FOR CHILDREN BEHIND IN SCHOOL



With a hybrid plan for classes in learning cells and in the C.C. children returned this 4th of June. They are expecting to improve their school performance as this will help them have a better future. Parents are very pleased to have their children back in school as they recognize the benefits it has on their children's lives. The response has been very favorable, having an increase of 25% in registration.



Lack of resources, not having a fixed address, and the need to work at an early age, are constants that occur among children in elementary and middle school. At the beginning of April 2022, a learning cell opened in the Terrace community to support children with tutoring. With the support of scholarship recipients Raquel, Nicol, and Julio were able to carry out this project.
