He boasts with great pride that his students graduated for their musical preparation, 60% have dedicated themselves to music professionally.

"Music is a very good resource for training young people, since it takes them away from the streets. In their rehearsals, they leave all their problems outside" Maestro Silva comments and adds: "In this class everyone is welcome, and the invitation to young people and adults to be part of the Community Center orchestra is still open, the only requirement is to want to learn."

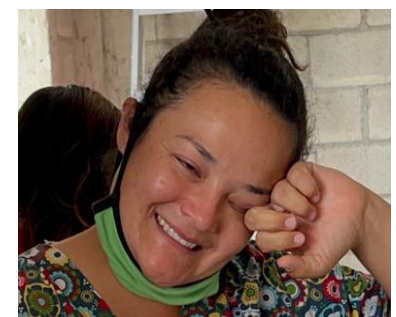

possible thanks to the auxiliaries of each community, they are in charge of the planning and selection of work, the place and the requirements for everyone to be present and carry out the work. Aureliano -as head of the program- visits all projects to help and guide the work towards the objectives. He stays with the community that has less experience and then, if he has enough time, he returns to supervise. On Monday he visits to find out the progress, based on the reports made by the assistants. Scholars also help with progress reports. The great satisfactions are that the sponsors are happy and surprised by the kindness of the program and that the beneficiary is gaining confidence by integrating. One of the most significant experiences was that a lady who was just joining the program always wanted them to be with her and kindly offered food. He looked very happy despite his poor health and he felt so much like family that he gave each of the members of the group nicknames. The last days of his life he took the joy of the BAM community and finally died a peaceful death.

The dads program helps those who cannot afford to have a green house or who already have it, but want to improve or repair it, to have a decent living condition. There are groups of this program in all the communities where BAM works, some do 3 to 4 works per week. In total there are 12 or 13 projects every Sunday, with approximately 80 parents. Those who pay hours for their green house or are

applicants or volunteers with different trades participate, and that's why it has worked, because there is knowledge and experience. In this program miracles are made with the resource that is given to them. Aureliano Crisóstomo, the person in charge of this program, comments that the parents have understood and have committed to the project, wanting to help. The solidity of the work of parents is



GRANDPARENTS PROGRAM TAKES STRENGTH IN HIS SECOND STAGE

This program attends to the affective needs of the people most appreciated due to the experience they have accumulated over the years: grandparents. Coordinated by the auxiliaries and leaders of Altiplano, Terrazas I and Lomas del Valle, each month they go to their homes to take them to a “green house” where 36 older adults share some quality time, starting with a testimonial session where they narrate their experiences, share their states mood and then engage in recreational activities of their choice, such as music, dance, painting, and drawing. In addition, they are treated with haircuts, nail painting, beauty masks and at the end a pantry is raffled off, which makes their existence more bearable and they look forward to that day.

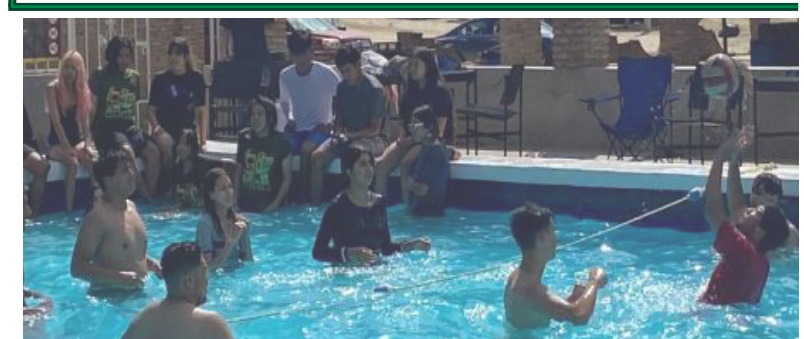

LINKED COURSES THROUGH C.C. WITH CECATI

Authorities from the General Directorate of Training Centers for Industrial Work, (CECATI) and the director of school 144, Leopoldo Cruz Molina, approved to teach and endorse courses for people from this community who seek to improve themselves; they have specialized teachers in these training workshops. At the end of these courses, they receive an official certificate certified by the SEP, which will allow them to improve their income and give their families a more prosperous life.



The Initial and Preschool Educational Assistant course began on September 17, with three-hour sessions on Saturdays and was very well received by the community, since they will be trained to work in a daycare center or as preschool support.



On the other hand, the Dynamic Conversational English course has been in great demand, since registration for the second course is already complete, which has two schedules, Saturdays from 2:00 to 4:00 pm and from 4:00 to 6:00 pm.

In the same way, the 20-hour Office course began on September 12 with 33 students enrolled, with the convenience of attending 2-hour sessions on Saturdays. In this course they will learn the use of computer programs and tools for office work.

Some joined other teams at a higher level, particularly one selected to go to the Puerto Vallarta team stands out, while on the other hand, other young people dropped out due to their school demands. The members of this new group are very enthusiastic and want to learn, an interest that is evident by their perseverance, only some feel frustrated by the lack of previous knowledge and skills in this sport, which shows the importance of instilling interest by extracurricular activities from an early age in children.

PRODUCTIVE PROJECTS ARE CONSOLIDATED

The area of P.P. coordinated by Eréndira Flores with her assistant Rosa Idalia Hernández and the advice of Eduardo Monroy, a graduate in Community Development, work as a team to help families improve their economy through advice and training to create small businesses. The first step is to help them clarify the ideas of what they want to do, according to the knowledge of the activity and the previous experience that allows them to have a profitable idea. In the second step comes the training, which is provided at the

Business School. In parallel, they are given the tools to do market analysis, so that they know the demand for the product or service they want to do, the competition they will face, and the analysis of production costs and sales prices. To materialize the projects, they are granted loans that are authorized by a council made up of assistants and leaders. At all stages they are given advice and accompaniment, so that their company is successful. An example of successful microenterprises are bakery, sewing, and burritos.



BAKERY A PRODUCTIVE PROJECT OF SUCCESS

The bakery located in Plaza San José is a productive project that supports families in the BAM community. It started in 2019 as a workshop until April 2022, training in the production and marketing of bread, with the aim of creating trades and later, businesses. Currently, those in charge of the project are Margarita Villarreal and Janeth Reyes, whose hard work does not go unnoticed.



The sale is essential since depending on the demand is how the bread is produced. The profits are used mainly for the purchase of inputs, the rest is for producers and sellers, although work continues to improve, because in the words of Janeth, it is close to obtaining an oven that would reduce production time by almost half, which facilitates both production and distribution by vendors and subsequent distribution by route, which is constantly expanding, passing through the Community Center, Altiplano, Maclovio Rojas, Laurel, Florido, Morita and Refugio. The project today has very good numbers, thanks to the participation of everyone who makes it possible.

MASS GRADUATION FROM BEAUTY GROUPS



This Sunday, October 23, 32 people graduated under the coordination of Rosa Evelia Gómez. This event included 11 graduates of the Nail workshop of the Terrazas cell. 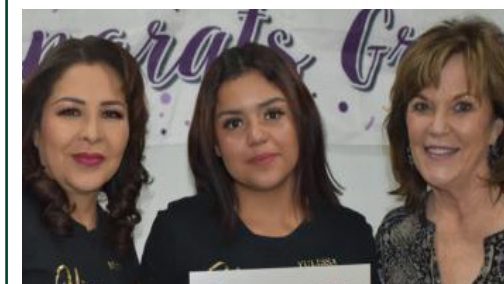
